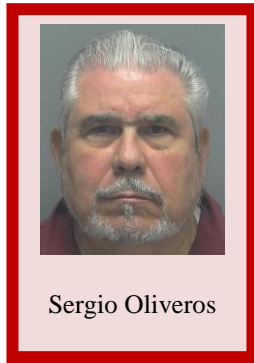

Life in Prison

Sergio Oliveros, 71, was sentenced to life in prison after being found guilty by a jury of Capital Sexual Battery on a Child Less than 12 years of age and 2 counts of Lewd or Lascivious Molestation.

The crime occurred in 2016 when the 11 year old victim's family visited the defendant's home.

Assistant State Attorneys Heather Searcy and Tyler Lovejoy prosecuted the case.

Witness Tampering

David Daniels was sentenced to 10 years in prison after being found guilty of Tampering with a Witness, Victim or Informant. This sentence will be served consecutive to a 5 year sentence he is currently serving on a robbery case we recently prosecuted.

He was sentenced immediately following the Collier County jury returning a guilty verdict.

Assistant State Attorneys James Stewart and Sabsina Nunez handled the case.

Guilty as Charged

Daniel Aquino Longoria, 24, was found guilty as charged for Leaving the Scene of a Crash Involving Death, Second Degree Arson of a Structure, Tampering with or Fabricating Physical Evidence (2 counts), Driving with License Suspended or Revoked, and False Report of a Crime.

In May 2015, Longoria drove his car into a man who was riding his bicycle home from work. He then attempted to conceal the body from view and fled the scene. Longoria also reported his car stolen but it was soon recovered and had been intentionally set on fire. Evidence from the vehicle tied Longoria to the crime.

He faces up to 55 years in prison when he is sentenced on September 14th. Assistant State Attorney Michael Colombo and Assistant State Attorney Mara Marzano of our Homicide Unit prosecuted the case.

Prosecutor Nominated for Recognition by MADD

Assistant State Attorney Martin Stark of our Homicide Unit was recognized recently by MADD, Mothers Against Drunk Driving, at the MADD Florida Law Enforcement Recognition and Training.

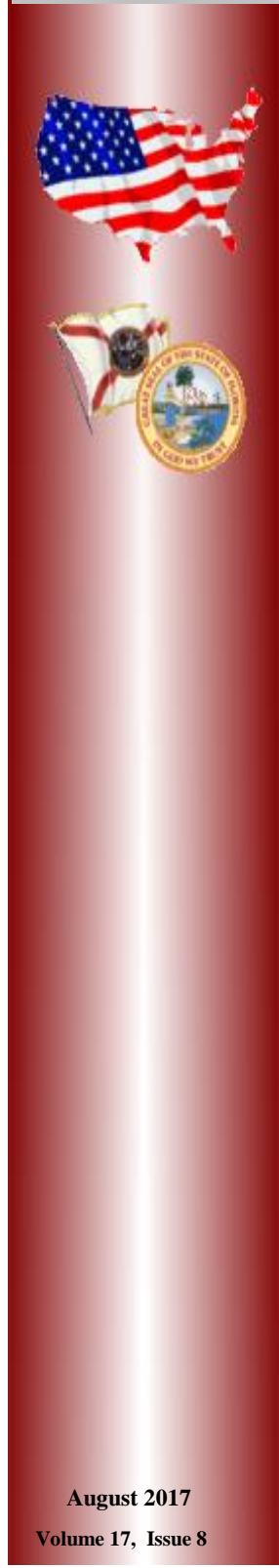

Manslaughter Sentencing

Dalvon Deon Lawrence, 19, was sentenced to 20 years in prison after being found guilty of Manslaughter with a Firearm and Shooting At/Into an Occupied Vehicle following a three day trial.

The March 2016 incident occurred in Fort Myers when Lawrence randomly shot a gun at a moving car. The driver he shot crashed his car into a concrete wall and later died from his injuries.

Assistant State Attorney Andreas Gardiner of our Homicide Unit and Assistant State Attorney Hanna Renna handled the case.

Arson to Defraud

Delourdes Luxama Lalanne, 51, was found guilty at trial of First Degree Arson of a Dwelling and Burning to Defraud an Insurer.

In September 2015, Lalanne set three fires in Lehigh. Two fires were in her home and one in her vehicle that was parked in her garage.

Lalanne then filed two insurance claims with two different insurance carriers as a result of the fires.

Lalanne faces up to 35 years in prison at her sentencing on September 19th. Assistant State Attorney Malcam Godwin handled the case
