The Lee County Grand Jury met today and has indicted Andrew J. Castor, 19, on 3 charges: First Degree Murder (capital felony), Grand Theft of a Motor Vehicle (3rd degree felony) and First Degree Burglary (1st degree punishable by life).

He is being held on no bond. Arraignment is set for Monday, October 27, 2008. A copy of the indictment is attached.

INDICTMENT FOR

- 1) First Degree Murder, F.S. 782.04(1), Capital Felony**
- 2) Grand Theft Of Motor Vehicle, F.S. 812.014, Third Degree Felony**
- 3) First Degree Burglary With Assault Or Battery, F.S. 810.02(2)(a), PBL Felony**

In the name of and by the Authority of the State of Florida:

The Grand Jurors of the State of Florida, impaneled and sworn to inquire and true presentment make in and for the County of Lee upon their oath do present that **ANDREW J. CASTOR:**

Count 1: On or about August 2, 2008 in Lee County, Florida, did unlawfully, from a premeditated design to effect the death of a human being, or while engaged in the perpetration of or in the attempt to perpetrate a burglary, kill and murder Bianca Marela Meza Interiano, a human being, by stabbing or lacerating her with a deadly weapon, to-wit: a knife or similar sharp edged weapon, contrary to Florida Statute 782.04(1),

Count 2: On or about August 2, 2008 in Lee County, Florida, did knowingly obtain or use, or endeavor to obtain or use, a motor vehicle, to-wit: a 2004 gold Honda, the property of another, to-wit: Bianca Marela Meza Interiano, as owner or custodian thereof, with the intent to temporarily or permanently deprive the owner or custodian of a right to the motor vehicle, or a benefit therefrom, or to appropriate the motor vehicle to the defendant's own use, or to the use of any person not entitled thereto, contrary to Florida Statute 812.014,

Count 3: On or about August 2, 2008 in Lee County, Florida, did unlawfully enter or remain in a certain structure, to-wit: a dwelling, located at or in the vicinity of 1122 Country Club Boulevard, Apt. B, Cape

Coral, in the County and State aforesaid, the property of Bianca Marela Meza Interiano, as owner or custodian thereof, with the intent to commit an offense therein, to-wit: assault or battery or sexual battery and in the course of committing the offense, did make an assault or battery upon a person, to-wit: Bianca Marela Meza Interiano, contrary to Florida Statute 810.02(2)(a),

Against the peace and dignity of the State of Florida.
